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1.0 SUMMARY AND VIEWS

Executive Summary

1.1 CAP123 - Quorum at Amendments Panel meetings held via teleconference was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the Amendments Panel on 31st March 2006. CAP123 proposes to amend CUSC 8.9.2 to ensure the available conference provisions within CUSC 8.7.8 can be fully utilised and that meetings held via this provision are capable of being quorate.

National Grid's View

1.2 National Grid, as the proposer of CAP123 is supportive of the Amendment Proposal, believing that it would better facilitate achievement of the Applicable CUSC Objective (a).

Amendment Panels View

1.3 The Amendments Panel agreed that CAP123 should proceed to wider consultation by National Grid, for a period of 3 weeks.

1.0 PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This is a consultation document issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State.
- 1.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP123, this document seeks views from industry members relating to the Amendment Proposal.
- 2.3 CAP123 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on 31st March 2006. The Amendments Panel determined that CAP123 was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid.
- 2.4 This consultation document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. Representations received in response to this consultation document will be included in National Grid's Amendment Report that will be furnished to the Authority for their decision.
- 2.5 This consultation document has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. An electronic copy can be found on the National Grid website, at www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Codes/ and the Amendment Proposal form. This document invites views upon CAP123 and the closing date is 25th April 2006 for responses including any Consultation Alternatives.
- 2.6 CUSC Parties are reminded that any Consultation Alternatives must be submitted by the above closing date and must be in writing and contain sufficient detail in accordance with the requirements within CUSC 8.15.2

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

3.1 CAP123 proposes to amend CUSC 8.9.2 to ensure the available conference provisions within CUSC 8.7.8 can be fully utilised and that meetings held via

- this provision are capable of being a quorate meeting of the Amendments Panel.
- 3.2 CUSC 8.9 details the quorum requirements for all Amendments Panel meetings. CUSC 8.9.2 requires a quorum of 6 Panel Member votes "in person" (not persons) and one of those votes shall be National Grid's.
- 3.3 This means all meetings need a minimum of 6 votes "in person" to be quorate (i.e. one National Grid Panel Member, one Panel Member and 2 rightly appointed Alternates by 4 Panel Members which equals 6 votes in person). Therefore without a reference to CUSC 8.7.8 any Panel meetings not held "in person" i.e. via teleconference are incapable of being quorate in accordance with 8.9.2

4.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

Proposed Amendment

- 4.1 CAP123 would better facilitate CUSC Objective;
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the Licensee of the obligations imposed upon it by the act and the Transmission Licence
- 4.2 By providing the Amendments Panel with the flexibility to arrange meetings without the need to travel to a specified place thus ensuring time and resources are utilised in an economic and efficient manner. Also urgent meetings can be held as soon as possible using teleconference facilities.

5.0 PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

5.1 National Grid proposes CAP123 should be Implemented 10 business days after an Authority decision, because it has no material impact or effect on CUSC Parties. In accordance with 8.19.3(b) views are invited on this proposed implementation date.

6.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

6.1 CAP123 requires amendments to CUSC 8.9.2. The text required to give effect to the Proposal is contained in Annex 1 of this document.

7.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY DOCUMENTS

7.1 CAP123 has no impact upon Core Industry Documents or Industry Computer Systems/Processes as it is a straightforward Amendment to rectify a minor defect.

8.0 INITIAL VIEW OF THE AMENDMENTS PANEL

8.1 The Amendments Panel agreed that CAP123 should proceed to wider consultation by National Grid, for a period of 3 weeks.

9.0 INITIAL VIEW OF NATIONAL GRID

9.1 National Grid believes CAP123 would ensure conference provisions can be fully utilised by the Amendments Panel as and when required and would better achieve CUSC Applicable Objective (a).

8.9.2 Subject to Paragraph 8.9.3, a quorum shall be 6 **Panel Members** who have a vote present (Subject to 8.7.8) in person or by their alternates, of whom at least one shall be appointed by **The Company**.

The Panel Secretary will inform the Proposer of the rejection and report the matter to the Panel at their next meeting. The Panel can reverse the Panel Secretary's decision and if this happens the Panel Secretary will inform the Proposer.
