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1.0 SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Executive Summary

- 1.1 CAP123 Quorum at Amendments Panel meetings held via teleconference was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the Amendments Panel on 31st March 2006. The Amendments Panel determined that it was appropriate for the proposal to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid. This consultation closed on 25th April 2006.
- 1.2 CAP123 proposes to amend CUSC 8.9.2 to ensure the available conference provisions within CUSC 8.7.8 can be fully utilised and that meetings held via this provision are capable of being quorate.

National Grid Recommendation

- 1.3 National Grid believes CAP123 would better facilitate the CUSC Applicable Objective (a) and as proposer believes it should be approved as it would provide the Amendments Panel with full flexibility to hold quorate meetings via the conferencing provisions within the CUSC.
- 1.4 National Grid recommends that, should the Authority approve CAP123, implementation should be ten business days after the Authority's decision.

Amendment Panel Recommendation

1.5 The Amendments Panel voted unanimously that CAP123 did better facilitate Applicable CUSC Objective (a).

2.0 PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 This Amendment Report has been prepared and issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State.
- 2.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP123 (see Annex 2) and the subsequent wider industry consultation that was undertaken by National Grid, this document is addressed and furnished to the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ("the Authority") in order to assist them in their decision whether to implement Amendment Proposal CAP123.
- 2.3 CAP123 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on 31st March 2006 and the Amendments Panel determined that CAP123 was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid.
- 2.4 This document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. It incorporates National Grid's recommendations to the Authority concerning the Amendment. Copies of all representations received in response to the consultation have been also been included and a 'summary' of the representations received is also provided. Copies of each of the responses to the consultation are included as Annex 3 to this document.
- 2.5 This Amendment Report has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. An electronic copy can be found on the National Grid website, at www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Codes/.

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- 3.1 CAP123 proposes to amend CUSC 8.9.2 to ensure the available conference provisions within CUSC 8.7.8 can be fully utilised and that meetings held via this provision are capable of being a quorate meeting of the Amendments Panel.
- 3.2 CUSC 8.9 details the quorum requirements for all Amendments Panel meetings. CUSC 8.9.2 requires a quorum of 6 Panel Member votes "in person" (not persons) and one of those votes shall be National Grid's.
- This means all meetings need a minimum of 6 votes "in person" to be quorate (i.e. one National Grid Panel Member, one Panel Member and 2 rightly appointed Alternates by 4 Panel Members which equals 6 votes in person). Therefore without a reference to CUSC 8.7.8, any Panel meetings not held "in person" i.e. via teleconference are incapable of being quorate in accordance with 8.9.2.

4.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

Proposed Amendment

- 4.1 CAP123 would better facilitate the CUSC Objective(s);
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the Licensee of the obligations imposed upon it by the act and the Transmission Licence; and
- 4.2 By providing the Amendments Panel with the flexibility to arrange meetings without the need to travel to a specified place thus ensuring time and resources are utilised in an economic and efficient manner. Also urgent meetings can be held as soon as possible using teleconference facilities.

5.0 PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

- 5.1 National Grid proposes CAP123 should be implemented 10 business days after an Authority decision because it has no material implementation issues for CUSC Parties. In accordance with paragraph 8.19.3(b) of the CUSC, views were invited on this proposed implementation date.
- 5.2 No respondents to the CAP123 consultation expressed a view on the proposed implementation date. There is, therefore, no disparity between the view of the Industry and that of National Grid.

6.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

6.1 CAP123 requires amendments to Section 8.9.2 of the CUSC. The text required to give effect to the Proposed Amendment is contained in Annex 1 of this document.

7.0 IMPACT ON CUSC PARTIES

7.1 CAP123 has no impact upon CUSC parties because it is a straightforward Amendment to rectify a minor defect.

8.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY DOCUMENTS

8.1 CAP123 has no impact upon Core Industry Documents or Other Industry Documents because it is a straightforward Amendment to rectify a minor defect.

9.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY COMPUTER SYSTEMS OR PROCESSES

9.1 CAP123 has no impact upon on Industry Computer Systems or Processes.

11.0 AMENDMENT PANEL RECOMMENDATION

- 11.1 The CUSC Amendments Panel Recommendation Vote on CAP123 was conducted at the Panel Meeting on 19th May 2006.
- 11.2 The Panel voted unanimously that CAP123 DID better facilitate Applicable CUSC Objective (a).

11.3 The National Grid Panel Member also noted that CAP123 had been raise, following concerns that the Amendments Panel had raised in relation to 8.9.2.

12.0 NATIONAL GRID RECOMMENDATION

- 12.1 National Grid believes CAP123 should be approved as it would ensure conference provisions within the CUSC can be fully utilised by the Amendments Panel as and when required, and therefore would better achieve CUSC Applicable Objective (a).
- 12.2 Also National Grid recommends that, should the Authority approve CAP123, implementation should be ten business days after the Authority's decision.

13.0 COMMENTS ON DRAFT AMENDMENT REPORT

13.1 National Grid received no responses following the publication of the draft Amendment Report. The following table provides an overview of each representation. Copies of the representations are attached as Annex 4.

It is proposed to change CUSC 8.9.2 to ensure the available conference provisions within CUSC 8.7.8 can be fully utilised and that meetings held via this provision are capable of being a quorate meeting of the Amendments Panel.

CUSC 8.9 details the quorum requirements for all Amendments Panel meetings. CUSC 8.9.2 requires a quorum of 6 Panel Member votes "in person" (not persons) and one of those votes shall be National Grid's.

This means all meetings need to be "in person" to be quorate. Therefore without a reference to CUSC 8.7.8 any Panel meetings not held "in person" i.e. via teleconference is incapable of being quorate in accordance with 8.9.2

This Amendment proposes to include a reference to CUSC 8.7.8 within the Quorum provisions to ensure any Amendments Panel meetings in the future held via conference are capable of being a quorate meeting.
