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1.0 SUMMARY AND VIEWS

Executive Summary

- 1.1 CAP130 CUSC Connection Application form Fixed and Variable Application Fees was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the Amendments Panel on 29th September 2006. CAP130 proposes to amend the CUSC Connection Application Forms within Exhibits B (Connection Application), D (Use of System Application), I (Modification Application) and Q (BELLA Application) to provide information to applicants regarding their choice in application fee between fixed and variable fee and to include a tick box to request applicants to indicate their application fee choice.
- 1.2 CAP130 will therefore create a formal process which enables Users to indicate their application fee choice.

National Grid's View

1.3 National Grid, as the proposer of CAP130 is supportive of the Amendment Proposal, believing that it would better facilitate achievement of the Applicable CUSC Objective (a).

Amendment Panels View

1.4 The Amendments Panel agreed that CAP130 should proceed to wider consultation by National Grid, for a period of 4 weeks.

2.0 PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 This is a consultation document issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State.
- 2.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP130, this document seeks views from industry members relating to the Amendment Proposal.
- 2.3 CAP130 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on 29th September 2006. The Amendments Panel determined that CAP130 was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid.
- 2.4 This consultation document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. Representations received in response to this consultation document will be included in National Grid's Amendment Report that will be furnished to the Authority for their decision.
- 2.5 This consultation document has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. An electronic copy can be found on the National Grid website, at www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Codes/ and the Amendment Proposal form. This document invites views upon CAP130 and the closing date is 3 November 2006 for responses including any Consultation Alternatives.
- 2.6 CUSC Parties are reminded that any Consultation Alternatives must be submitted by the above closing date and must be in writing and contain sufficient detail in accordance with the requirements within CUSC 8.15.2

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- 3.1 CAP130 Proposes to amend the CUSC Connection Application Forms within Exhibits B (Connection Application), D (Use of System Application), I (Modification Application) and Q (BELLA Application) to provide information to applicants regarding their choice in application fee between fixed and variable fee and to include a tick box to request applicants to indicate their application fee choice.
- 3.2 Whilst the Charging Statements make it clear that an Applicant can choose to pay the advance of National Grid's Engineering Charges on a fixed or variable basis, the Application forms themselves in the CUSC Exhibits B, D, I and Q do not provide applicants with the ability to indicate which fee they wish use for their application. This results in the need for National Grid to clarify which fee with the User thus creating a delay in the application process.

4.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

Proposed Amendment

- 4.1 In the opinion of National Grid CAP130 would better facilitate the CUSC Objective;
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the Licensee of the obligations imposed upon by the act and the Transmission Licence; and
- 4.2 This Amendment will remove inefficiencies and delays within the application process by ensuring all new applicants indicate their preferred method of application fee.

5.0 PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

5.1 National Grid proposes CAP130 should be implemented 10 business days after an Authority decision, as it would be beneficial for the User and National Grid because it will increase efficiency by preventing delays in the application process. In accordance with 8.19.3(b) views are invited on this proposed implementation date.

6.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

- 6.1 CAP130 requires amendments to Exhibit B Connection Application, Exhibit D Use of System Application, Exhibit I Modification Application, and Exhibit Q BELLA Application of the CUSC.
- 6.2 The text required to give effect to this Proposal is contained as Annex 1 of this document.

7.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY DOCUMENTS

7.1 CAP130 has no impact upon Core Industry Documents.

8.0 INITIAL VIEW OF THE AMENDMENTS PANEL

8.1 The Amendments Panel agreed that CAP130 should proceed to wider consultation by National Grid, for a period of 4 weeks subject.

9.0 INITIAL VIEW OF NATIONAL GRID

9.1 National Grid believes CAP130 would ensure a formal process is created to identify which application fee a User wishes to use and will therefore remove inefficiencies and delays within the application process.

It is proposed to amend the CUSC Application Forms within Exhibits B (Connection Application), D (Use of System Application), I (Modification Application) and Q (BELLA Application) to provide information to applicants regarding their choice in application fee between fixed and variable fee and to include a tick box to request applicants to indicate their application fee choice.

Description of Issue or Defect that Proposed Amendment seeks to Address (*mandatory by proposer*):

The CUSC and Charging Statements set out the obligations for an applicant to pay National Grid's Engineering Charges associated with an Application, based on the fees published in The Statement of Use of System Charges. The Charging Statements allow for the Engineering Charges to be levied on a fixed or variable basis, according to the wishes of the applicant.

While the Charging Statements make it clear that an Applicant can choose to pay the advance of National Grid's Engineering Charges on a fixed or variable basis, the Application forms themselves in the CUSC Exhibits B, D, I and Q do not provide applicants with the ability to indicate which fee they wish to use for their application.

Consequently this creates inefficiencies and delays in the application process as National Grid needs to clarify with the applicant which basis then intend to use before the application can be processed.

The Panel can reverse the Panel Secretary's decision and if this happens the Panel Secretary will inform the Proposer.
