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1.0 SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Executive Summary

- 1.1 CAP130 CUSC Connection Application form Fixed and Variable Application Fees was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the Amendments Panel on 29th September 2006. CAP130 proposes to amend the CUSC Connection Application Forms within Exhibits B (Connection Application), D (Use of System Application), I (Modification Application) and Q (BELLA Application) to provide information to Applicants regarding their choice in application fee between fixed and variable fee and to include a tick box to request Applicants to indicate their application fee choice.
- 1.2 CAP130 will therefore create a formal process which enables Users to indicate their application fee choice.

National Grid Recommendation

1.3 National Grid, as the proposer of CAP130 is supportive of the Amendment Proposal, believing that it would better facilitate achievement of the Applicable CUSC Objective (a) and should be implemented 10 Business Days after the Authority decision.

Amendment Panel Recommendation

1.4 The CUSC Amendments Panel Recommendation Vote on CAP130 was conducted at the Panel Meeting on 24th November 2006. The Panel unanimously recommends that CAP130 would better facilitate achievement of Applicable CUSC Objective (a) and (b) on the grounds of it aiding effective competition.

2.0 PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 This Amendment Report has been prepared and issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State.
- 2.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP130 (see Annex 2) and the subsequent wider industry consultation that was undertaken by National Grid, this document is addressed and furnished to the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ("the Authority") in order to assist them in their decision whether to implement Amendment Proposal CAP130.
- 2.3 CAP130 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on 29 September 2006 and the Amendments Panel determined that CAP130 was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid.
- 2.4 This document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. It incorporates National Grid's recommendations to the Authority concerning the Amendment. Copies of all representations received in response to the consultation have been also been included and a 'summary' of the representations received is also provided. Copies of each of the responses to the consultation are included as Annex 3 to this document.

2.5 This Amendment Report has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. An electronic copy can be found on the National Grid website, at www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Codes/.

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- 3.1 CAP130 proposes to amend the CUSC connection Application Forms within Exhibits B (Connection Application), D (use of System Application), I (Modification Application) and Q (BELLA Application) to provide information to Applicants regarding their choice.
- 3.2 Whilst the Charging Statements make it clear that an Applicant can choose to pay the advance of National Grid's Engineering Charges on a fixed or variable basis, the Application forms themselves in the CUSC Exhibits B, D, I and Q do not provide Applicants with the ability to indicate which fee they wish use for their application. Consequently, this results in a delay in the application process as National Grid has to clarify with the Applicant which fee they wish to use.
- 3.3. Therefore CAP130 proposes to amend the Application Forms with CUSC Exhibits B, D, I and Q to provide Applicants with details regarding their choice in fee and a tick box to indicate which fee they wish to utilise.

4.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

Proposed Amendment

- 4.1 In the view of National Grid CAP130 would better facilitate the CUSC Objective;
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the Licensee of the obligations imposed upon it by the act and the Transmission Licence; and
- 4.2 National Grid believes CAP130 will remove inefficiencies and delays within the application process by ensuring all new Applicants indicate their preferred method of application fee when applying to National Grid, therefore better facilitate the achievement of objective (a).

5.0 PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

- 5.1 National Grid proposes CAP130 should be implemented 10 Business Days after an Authority decision, as it would be beneficial for the User and National Grid because it will increase efficiency in the application process. In accordance with 8.19.3(b) views were invited on this proposed implementation date.
- 5.2 No respondents to the CAP130 consultation expressed a view on the proposed implementation date. There is, therefore, no disparity between the view of the Industry and that of National Grid

6.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

6.1 CAP130 requires amendments to Exhibit B Connection Application, Exhibit D Use of System Application, Exhibit I Modification Application, and Exhibit Q BELLA Application of the CUSC.

6.2 The text required to give effect to the Proposal is contained in Annex 1 of this document.

7.0 IMPACT ON CUSC PARTIES

7.1 CAP130 will improve the selection of the CUSC Parties preferred payment method for National Grids Engineering Charges.

8.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY DOCUMENTS

The CUSC and Charging Statements set out the obligations for an Applicant to pay National Grid's Engineering Charges associated with an Application, based on the fees published in The Statement of Use of System Charges. The Charging Statements allow for the Engineering Charges to be levied on a fixed or variable basis, according to the wishes of the Applicant.

While the Charging Statements make it clear that an Applicant can choose to pay the advance of National Grid's Engineering Charges on a fixed or variable basis, the Application forms themselves in the CUSC Exhibits B, D, I and Q do not provide Applicants with the ability to indicate which fee they wish to use for their application.

Consequently this creates inefficiencies and delays in the application process as National Grid needs to clarify with the Applicant which basis then intend to use before the application can be processed.
