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1.0 SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Executive Summary

- 1.1 CAP176 Correction of errors contained in the provisions for postimplementation reviews for Urgent Amendment Proposals was submitted to the Amendments Panel for consideration on the 25th September 2009. The Proposer requested that the Amendment Proposal proceed directly to wider consultation by The Company.
- 1.2 CAP176 seeks to amend the process described in CUSC 8.21.1.9 through which a review will be conducted following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal. This proposal seeks to make explicit how such a review will take place and tidy up the existing CUSC provision which currently contains some errors.
- 1.3 The proposal also seeks to correct a similar error in the clause relating to post-implementation review after implementation of an amendment in accordance with the Transmission Licence other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures (8.23.5).

Amendments Panel's View

1.4 At the Amendments Panel meeting on 27th November 2009, Panel Members voted unanimously that CAP176 better facilitates Applicable CUSC Objective (a) as it would improve the efficiency of the procedures in place for modification of the CUSC.

National Grid's View

- 1.5 As proposer, National Grid supports implementation of CAP176 on the basis that it better achieves the Applicable CUSC Objectives by clarifying the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal.
- 1.6 It also better achieves the Applicable CUSC Objectives by clarifying the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following amendment to the CUSC in accordance with the Transmission Licence (other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures).

PURPOSE AND INTRODUCTION

- 2.1 This Amendment Report has been prepared and issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State.
- 2.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP176 (see Annex 2) and the subsequent wider industry consultation that was undertaken by National Grid, this document is addressed and furnished to the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ("the Authority") in order to assist them in their decision whether to implement Amendment Proposal CAP176.
- 2.3 CAP176 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on the 25th September

- 2009. The Amendments Panel determined that CAP176 was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid.
- 2.4 This document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. It incorporates National Grid's recommendations to the Authority concerning the Amendment. A summary of the representations received in response to the Company consultation is included and copies of each of the responses to the consultation are included in Volume 2 of this Amendment Report.
- 2.5 This Amendment Report has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. An electronic copy can be found on the National Grid website, at www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Codes/.

3.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENT

- 3.1 CAP176 seeks to amend the process described in the CUSC through which a review will be conducted following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal (8.21.1.9). This proposal seeks to make explicit how such a review will take place and tidy up the existing CUSC provisions which currently contain some errors.
- 3.2 The current wording within the CUSC regarding post-implementation review following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal contains a defect in that reference is made to Working Group Alternative Amendments (WGAAs), and the possibility for Working Groups to conduct the review. Under the CUSC provisions this would in fact not be possible as following implementation there would be no Working Group established through which such a review could be conducted nor original Amendment Proposal to which a WGAA may be raised. As such the provisions within the CUSC could not reasonably be applied to such a post-implementation review, and recent experience (particularly with CAP168 and CAP170 which were progressed as Urgent Amendment Proposals) has shown that the deficiency in this wording has caused confusion with regards the interpretation of the clause.
- 3.3 CAP176, therefore, seeks to introduce appropriate provisions within CUSC 8.21.1.9 to reflect how such a post-implementation review of an Urgent Amendment Proposal would be conducted i.e. by Standing Group, with reference being made to a possible alternative amendment which may be developed.
- 3.4 Currently the CUSC provisions require that such a review "shall" be carried out in all circumstances following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal. CAP176 seeks to introduce that such a review "may" be conducted, or "shall" only where there appears to be a reasonable level of support for such a review. This enhancement to the existing provision should ensure that such a review only takes place where it is deemed to be necessary by the CUSC Amendments Panel.
- 3.5 Section 8.23.5 of the CUSC describes the process through which a review will be conducted should amendment to the CUSC be made in accordance with the Transmission Licence (other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures). This clause also makes reference to WGAAs which, as with the post-implementation review for an Urgent Amendment Proposal, is not appropriate as a WGAA could not be raised with no original Amendment Proposal against which to raise such a WGAA. Therefore,

CAP176 seeks to clarify that the review would seek to determine if an alternative amendment would better facilitate the objectives as opposed to a WGAA.

4.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

Proposed Amendment

- 4.1 The Proposer considers that CAP176 would better facilitate the following Applicable CUSC Objective:
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the Licensee of the obligations imposed upon it by the act and the Transmission Licence;

By clarifying the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal; and clarifying the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following amendment to the CUSC in accordance with the Transmission Licence (other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures).

5.0 PROPOSED IMPLEMENTATION

5.1 National Grid proposes that CAP176 should be implemented three Business Days following a decision by the Authority. No responses were received on the proposed implementation date following the Company consultation.

6.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

- 6.1 CAP176 requires amendment to sections 8.21.1.9 and 8.23.5 of the CUSC.
- 6.2 The text required to give effect to the Amendment Proposal is contained as Annex 1 of this document.

7.0 IMPACT ON INDUSTRY DOCUMENTS

Impact on Core Industry Documents

7.1 CAP176 has no impact upon Core Industry Documents.

Impact on other Industry Documents

7.2 CAP176 has no impact upon other Industry Documents.

8.0 NATIONAL GRID VIEW

8.1 As proposer, National Grid supports implementation of CAP176 on the basis that it better achieves Applicable CUSC Objective (a) by clarifying the process through which a post-implementation review would take place following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal. CAP176 would

also clarify the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following amendment to the CUSC in accordance with the Transmission Licence (other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures).

9.0 INDUSTRY VIEWS AND REPRESENTATIONS

9.1 CAP176 was issued to wider consultation by National Grid on 7th October 2009 and received 4 representations. The following table provides an overview of the representations received; full copies are contained in the Amendment Report Volume 2.

10.0 COMMENTS ON THE DRAFT AMENDMENT REPORT

10.1 National Grid received one response following the publication of the first draft of the Amendment Report on 3rd November 2009. This response came from EDF Energy and indicated that the CAP176 draft Amendment Report and the summary therein of EDF Energy's submission to the Company consultation appear to be reasonable, comprehensive, and without error. EDF Energy notes the support given to the proposed amendment by the other respondents, and continues to support the amendment as better facilitating the Applicable CUSC Objectives. A copy of this representation is contained in Amendment Report Volume 2.

11.0 AMENDMENTS PANEL RECOMMENDATION

- 11.1 At the meeting of the CUSC Amendments Panel on 27th November 2009, the Panel Members voted unanimously that CAP176 better facilitates achievement of Applicable CUSC Objective (a). None of the Panel Members voted that it better facilitates achievement of Applicable CUSC Objective (b).
- 11.2 The table below shows a breakdown of Panel Members' voting against the CUSC Applicable Objectives and the rationale for such votes. For ease of reference, the Objectives are reproduced here:
 - (a) the efficient discharge by the licensee of the obligations imposed upon it under the Act and by this licence; and
 - (b) facilitating effective competition in the generation and supply of electricity, and (so far as consistent therewith) facilitating such competition in the sale, distribution and purchase of electricity.

12.0 NATIONAL GRID RECOMMENDATION

12.1 As proposer, National Grid supports implementation of CAP176 on the basis that it better achieves the Applicable CUSC Objective (a). National Grid considers that CAP176 would clarify the process through which a post-implementation review would take place following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal. CAP176 would also clarify the process through which a post-implementation review will take place following amendment to the CUSC in accordance with the Transmission Licence (other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures).

- 8.21.1.9 Where an **Urgent Amendment Proposal** results in an amendment being made in accordance with Paragraph 8.23, the **Amendments Panel** <a href="mailto:may or (where it appears to the **Amendments Panel** that there is a reasonable level of support for a review amongst **CUSC Parties**) shall, following such amendment, action a **Standing Group** determine whether or by a Working Group in accordance with Paragraphs-8.17 or 8.18 on terms specified by the **Amendments** Panel in order to consider and report as to whether any alternative amendment Working Group Alternative Amendment could, as compared with the such amendment being made better facilitate achieving the **Applicable CUSC Objectives** in respect of the subject matter of that **Urgent Amendment Proposal**.
 - 8.23.5 If an amendment is made to the CUSC in accordance with the Transmission Licence but other than pursuant to the other Amendment Procedures in this Section 8, the Amendments Panel shall determine whether or not to submit the amendment for review by a Standing Group in accordance with Paragraph 8.18 on terms specified by the Amendments Panel in order to consider and report as to whether any alternative amendment Working Group Alternative Amendment could, as compared with the such amendment being made better facilitate achieving the Applicable CUSC Objectives in respect of the subject matter of the original amendment.

This clause also makes reference to WGAAs – which again could not be raised in this instance as there will be no original Amendment Proposal against which such an alternative could be raised. As such this proposal seeks to clarify that the review would seek to determine if an alternative Amendment Proposal would better facilitate the objectives as opposed to a WGAA.
