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#### 1.0 SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

- 1.1 CAP106 corrects inconsistencies in Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC created by an interaction in the legal texts and subsequent implementation of CAP076 before CAP047. CAP106 clarifies that the Indexation provisions in Paragraph 4.5.1 are mandatory for System to Generator Intertripping Agreements but are optional (to be agreed between the User and National Grid) for any other Balancing Services Agreements.
- 1.2 CAP106 was proposed by National Grid and submitted to the CUSC Amendments Panel for consideration at their meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> October 2005 The Amendments Panel determined that the issue was appropriate to proceed to wider industry consultation by National Grid. The consultation closed on 15<sup>th</sup> November 2005.
- 1.3 National Grid received one response to the consultation on CAP106 which had no further comments on the proposal and supported CAP106.

#### **National Grid Recommendation**

- 1.4 National Grid recommends that CAP106 should be approved. National Grid believes that CAP106 will better facilitate Applicable CUSC Objective (a) (the efficient discharge by National Grid of the obligations imposed on it by the Act and the transmission licence) by improving the clarity and removal of uncertainty associated with the current wording of Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC.
- 1.5 National Grid recommends that CAP106 should be implemented 10 working days after the date of the Authority's decision letter for CAP106. In accordance with 8.19.3(b) views were invited on this proposed implementation date and no comments were received.

## 2.0 PURPOSE AND SCOPE OF THE REPORT

- 2.1 This Amendment Report has been prepared and issued by National Grid under the rules and procedures specified in the Connection and Use of System Code (CUSC) as designated by the Secretary of State. It addresses issues relating to the correction of the existing text for Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC which is inconsistent with the intended provisions of the Paragraph.
- 2.2 Further to the submission of Amendment Proposal CAP106 (see Annex 1) and the subsequent wider industry consultation that was undertaken by National Grid, this document is addressed and furnished to the Gas and Electricity Markets Authority ("the Authority") in order to assist them in their decision whether to implement Amendment Proposal CAP106.
- 2.3 This document outlines the nature of the CUSC changes that are proposed. It incorporates National Grid's recommendations to the Authority concerning the Amendment. Copies of all representations received in response to the consultation have been also been included and a 'summary' of the representations received is also provided. Copies of each of the responses to the consultation are included as Annex 3 to this document.
- 2.4 This Amendment Report has been prepared in accordance with the terms of the CUSC. #### 3.0 THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT

# **Background**

- 3.1 On 28<sup>th</sup> September 2004 the Authority approved CAP047 Alternative Amendment (A) (Introduction of a competitive process for the provision of Mandatory Frequency Response) for implementation on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2005.
- 3.2 On 10<sup>th</sup> June 2005 the Authority approved CAP076 original Amendment Proposal (Treatment of System to Generator Intertripping Schemes) for implementation on 15<sup>th</sup> July 2005.
- 3.3 The period between the Authority's approval decision on CAP047 and formal amendment of the CUSC was therefore over a year but during that period CAP076 was approved and implemented. There was an interaction between the legal text in these two proposals in relation to Paragraph 4.5.1 (Indexation Application) and the precise mechanics of the implementation of CAP047 and CAP076 mean that 4.5.1 no longer reads clearly.

### **The Proposed Amendment**

3.4 National Grid believes that an amendment to Paragraph 4.5.1 should now be made to clarify this text including re-introducing the clarity in CAP076 that Indexation where applicable to System to Generator Operational Intertripping Agreements is mandatory whereas in CAP047 Alternative Amendment (A) Indexation is optional for any other Balancing Service Agreements.

### 4.0 IMPLEMENTATION AND TIMESCALES

4.1 National Grid recommends that CAP106 should be implemented 10 working days after the date of the Authority's decision letter for CAP106. In accordance with 8.19.3(b) views were invited on this proposed implementation date and no comments were received.

### 5.0 IMPACT ON THE CUSC

- 5.1 CAP106 will require amendments to Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC.
- 5.2 The text required to give effect to the Proposed Amendment is contained as Annex 2 of this document.

# 6.0 ASSESSMENT AGAINST APPLICABLE CUSC OBJECTIVES

6.1 National Grid believes that CAP106 will better facilitate Applicable CUSC Objective (a) (the efficient discharge by National Grid of the obligations imposed on it by the Act and the transmission licence) by improving the clarity and removal of uncertainty associated with the current wording of Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC.

**CAP: 106** 

Title of Amendment Proposal:

Amendment to revise Paragraph 4.5.1 (Indexation – Application) of the CUSC.

Description of the Proposed Amendment (mandatory by proposer):

It is proposed that the CUSC be amended to correct inconsistencies in Paragraph 4.5.1 created by an interaction in the legal texts and subsequent implementation of CAP076 and CAP047. The proposal will also in doing this, clarify that Indexation where applicable to System to Generator Operational Intertripping Agreements is mandatory (whereas indexation is optional (to be agreed between National Grid and a User) for any other Balancing Services Agreements.) This was provided for in CAP076, and was, in the view of the proposer, inadvertently overwritten in the implementation of these two Amendment proposals.

Description of Issue or Defect that Proposed Amendment seeks to Address (mandatory by proposer):

There was over a year between the Authority's approval decision on CAP047 and formal amendment of the CUSC to give effect to CAP047. However, during that period CAP076 was approved and implemented. There was an interaction between the legal text in these two proposals in relation to Paragraph 4.5.1 (Indexation – Application) and the precise mechanics of the implementation of CAP047 and CAP076 mean that 4.5.1 no longer reads clearly.

National Grid believes that an amendment to Paragraph 4.5.1 should now be made to clarify this text including re-introducing the clarity in CAP076 that Indexation where applicable to System to Generator Operational Intertripping Agreements is mandatory.

Impact on the CUSC (this should be given where possible):

Amend Paragraph 4.5.1 (Indexation - Application) to reflect correctly the Authority's decisions on both CAP047 and CAP076 and in doing so, to clarify that Indexation will be mandatory where applicable to System to Generator Operational Intertripping Agreements.

Impact on Core Industry Documentation (this should be given where possible):

None anticipated.

Impact on Computer Systems and Processes used by CUSC Parties (this should be given where possible):

None anticipated.

**Details of any Related Modifications to Other Industry Codes** (where known):

Justification for Proposed Amendment with Reference to Applicable CUSC Objectives\*\* (mandatory by proposer):

The terms of the Transmission Licence require National Grid to establish and operate procedures for the modification of the CUSC so as to better facilitate achievement of the Applicable CUSC Objectives.

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Issue: 1.0

Amendment of Paragraph 4.5.1 of the CUSC to reflect properly the Authority decisions on CAP047 and CAP076 would improve clarity and remove uncertainty from the CUSC documentation and hence enable National Grid to more easily and efficiently discharge it's obligations under the Act and the Transmission Licence and fulfil it's obligations to facilitate competition in the generation and supply of electricity.

# Part A - Text to give effect to the Proposed Amendment

#### 4.5 INDEXATION

## 4.5.1 Application

The provisions of this Paragraph 4.5 shall apply to payments made by NGC to a User pursuant to Paragraphs 4.2A.4(a) and (c) in respect of the provision of System to Generator Operational Intertripping, and

The provisions of this Paragraph 4.5 may:-

4.5.1.1 ; and

4.5.1.2 Paragraphs 4.2A.4(a) and (c) in respect of the provision of System to Generator Operational Intertripping,

(if agreed between NGC and a User) may be incorporated by reference into any other Balancing Services Agreement (other than a Mandatory Services Agreement) as a term thereof so as to apply in respect of payments made by NGC to that User in respect of the provision of other Balancing Services (other than Mandatory Ancillary Services) (but for the avoidance of doubt not so as to thereby create any obligations on NGC and that User under the CUSC in respect thereof).
