

21/04/2019 (Summary)	Met Office <u>SEPA</u> Natural Resources Wales	Today: A dry start in east with sunny spells, then some heavy showers developing, occasionally thundery. Cloudier further west with a band of showery rain moving east. Wet and windy weather reaching Northern Ireland then Wales and southwest England later.
		Tonight: Rain and strong winds crossing much of southern and central Britain with gales around coasts and severe gales for exposed parts of Wales and southwest England. Often rather cloudy elsewhere.

		- Some short term loss of power and other services is possible due to fallen branches
