This document provides you with an overview of how you can get involved in the change process for our frameworks*;

If you are new to the process and don't know where to start this is the document for you!

There are a range of ways to engage with the code change process that offers you choice depending on how much time you have and how actively you want to contribute to the change process. The options are shown in two sections depending on their primary purpose:

- To keep up to date with change and understand what the changes mean for you
- To actively contribute to the change process, collaborate with others to develop solutions and deliver improvements to our frameworks
