



Further south, patchy fog clears but with scattered heavy showers. Further north, sunny spells but showers towards northern and eastern coasts. Cold, breezy.
		Tonight: Southern areas cloudy with patchy rain, while more persistent rain lingers across some central regions. Northern Britain clearer with widespread frost but scattered wintry showers towards eastern and northern coasts.
