EDF Energy is delighted to have the opportunity to comment on CUSC Amendment Proposal 176, which we support. We record here our thanks the CUSC Governance Standing Group for their work with Grid in developing this CUSC Amendment Proposal.

We note that the baseline CUSC has provisions require that for Urgent Amendment Proposals, a post-implementation review "shall" be carried out in all circumstances where said Proposal is Implemented.

CAP176 seeks to introduce that such a review "may" be conducted, or "shall" only where there appears to be a reasonable level of support for such a review. We entirely agree that this should ensure that such a review only takes place where it is deemed to be necessary by the CUSC Amendments Panel, and avoid inefficient process "for process sake" which could arise from the existing CUSC wording.

Section 8.23.5 of the CUSC also has an error in referring to a working group alternative amendment in a context where this is not valid ; we note that CAP176 would correct the wording error.

CAP176 - Correction of errors contained in the provisions for post-implementation reviews for Urgent Amendment Proposals

This response is sent on behalf of Keadby Generation Ltd.; SSE Energy Supply Ltd.; SSE Generation Ltd.; Medway Power Ltd.; Slough Energy Supplies Ltd.; Airtricity Ltd. and Airtricity Generation (UK) Ltd.

We welcome the proposed changes associated with CAP176, namely:-

- 1) to amend the process described in CUSC 8.21.1.9 through which a review will be conducted following implementation of an Urgent Amendment Proposal by seeking to make explicit how such a review will take place and tidy up the existing CUSC provision which currently contains some errors; and
- 2) correct a similar error in the clause relating to post-implementation review after implementation of an amendment in accordance with the Transmission Licence other than pursuant to the standard Amendment Procedures (8.23.5).

This we believe is a pragmatic development in light of the recent experience with 'urgent' CUSC Amendment Proposals, and in particular the concerns that were raised at the CUSC Panel with respect to the process followed with CAP168 and CAP170.

We agree with the National Grid view, as set out in paragraphs 1.5 and 1.6 of the consultation document, that this change would better facilitate the Applicable CUSC Objectives and in particular Objective (a).
