<u>EDF Energy response to CAP175 : "Urgent Amendment Proposals – revision to process"</u>

EDF Energy is delighted to have the opportunity to comment on CUSC Amendment Proposal 175, which we support. We record here our thanks the CUSC Governance Standing Group for their work with Grid in developing this CUSC Amendment Proposal.

We note that one aspect of this new proposal makes clear that requests for urgency in respect of a new CUSC amendment proposal can come from any CUSC party or Consumer Focus, not just from the Party who raised the amendment proposal. We consider this to be an improvement against baseline as the existing restriction does not have any obvious justification; if others wish to make a case that a new modification proposal fits the criteria for Urgency, and the actual proposer for whatever reason has not made the case, then others (any CUSC party or Consumer Focus) should indeed be permitted to make the case for Urgency for consideration in the usual manner.

We note that another aspect of this new proposal mandates that a meeting of the CUSC panel shall be convened to consider Urgency requests, makes pragmatic suggestions as to the approach to be taken by the administrators of the CUSC where not all panellists are readily available for what would be a very short-notice meeting, and it mandates that a report shall be prepared which documents both the CUSC Panel's and Ofgem's position on these requests for Urgency. These aspects of the proposal also seem to represent good practice and, again, we would support them.

CAP175 - Urgent Amendment Proposals - Revision to Process

This response is sent on behalf of Keadby Generation Ltd.; SSE Energy Supply Ltd.; SSE Generation Ltd.; Medway Power Ltd.; Slough Energy Supplies Ltd.; Airtricity Ltd. and Airtricity Generation (UK) Ltd.

We welcome the proposed changes associated with CAP175, namely:-

- 1) The ability to recommend that a proposal be treated as urgent be extended to include the National Consumer Council and BSC Parties (as well as CUSC Parties):
- 2) The Panel Chairman to determine the time by which a decision on urgent matters should be made;
- 3) A meeting of the CUSC Amendments Panel to be convened to discuss any urgent recommendations;
- 4) Specification of the process to be followed should not all Panel Members be available for the meeting, or should it not be possible to contact an appropriate number of Panel Members; and
- 5) The Amendment Report to include the Authority and Panel view on urgency (as well as the proposer's view as currently provided for in the CUSC).

This we believe is a pragmatic development in light of the recent experience with 'urgent' CUSC Amendment Proposals. We agree with the National Grid view, as set out in paragraph 1.6 of the consultation document, that this change would better facilitate the Applicable CUSC Objectives and in particular Objective (a).

For the avoidance of doubt, if the proposal outlined in the recent consultation from Ofgem relating to the future appointment of an independent Chair of the CUSC Panel were to proceed then we could see the case for removing the limitation on the Panel Chairman (as set out in paragraph 3.4.2 of the consultation document) where urgency is being requested by the Company.
