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Background

- Interconnectors and Suppliers use the application form for acceding to the CUSC and gain rights to use the Transmission System

Summary of Defect

- Current process is not efficient as the application form does not capture all the information required to process the application efficiently

Proposed CUSC Modification

- This Proposal seeks to;
 - Capture all the required information in the application form to enable National Grid to process the application effectively
- It is proposed that a number of changes are made to CUSC Exhibit F;
 - Provision of VAT number
 - Provision of a UK address for companies registered outside the UK
 - Selection of a method of securitisation method for Suppliers
 - Clarification in Section A that the application is deemed effective following receipt of the application fee

Justification against Applicable CUSC Objectives

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- *(a) the efficient discharge by The Company of the obligations imposed upon it by the Act and the Transmission Licence*
- Improving the efficiency of the application process will help the efficient discharge of the Company's obligation to process applications

Justification against Self Governance criteria

(a) Is unlikely to have a material effect on:

- i. Existing or future electricity consumers, and*
- ii. Competition in the generation, distribution, or supply of electricity or any commercial activities connected with the generation, distribution or supply of electricity; and*
- iii the operation of the National Electricity Transmission System; and*
- iv matters relating to sustainable development, safety or security of supply, or the management of market or network emergencies; and*
- (v) The CUSC's governance procedures or the CUSC's modification procedures, and*

(b) is unlikely to discriminate between different classes of CUSC Parties;

- The proposed changes will not have any material effect on the above. The changes being proposed are to streamline the application process and make it more efficient.

 - whether CMP233 should be progressed through Self-governance
 - whether CMP233 is exempt from the ongoing SCR
 - how to progress CMP233
 - Workgroup
 - Code Administrator Consultation
