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What is the issue?

This modification is seeking to remove any gender specific references or terminology within the CUSC and make it Gender Neutral.

Why change?

These changes will have a positive impact, as they will remove any gender bias, inequality, and discrimination within the CUSC. They will also acknowledge diversity and convey respect to all people.

What is the Proposer's solution?

The following changes will be required to the CUSC (along with some other minor typographical amendments):

Note that following feedback at the CUSC Panel on 26 November 2021, we will change "Chair" to "Chairperson" to align language with Standard Condition C10 2(f) of the Transmission Licence.

At the same meeting a question was asked whether changing "He/She" to "They" removes a singular obligation which arguably could create confusion as to whom the obligation is on. However, CUSC 11.2.6(e) already acknowledges that references to singular include the plural and vice versa so would look at any reference to "they" as having the meaning the context required.

Legal text issues raised in the consultation

 A respondent suggested that for ease of reading, Section 7.3.3 (a) could read "Where, in conducting an arbitration under this Section 7, an arbitrator or panel of arbitrators finds themselves or itself considering a Charging Dispute (whether or not forming part of an Other Dispute), they or it shall have no jurisdiction" as the plural could indicate the arbitrators forming the panel and is used in that way in 7.4.3 "Any arbitrator or panel of arbitrators ... such issues as are referred to them"

• The same respondent noted that the Section 8.22.10 (c) was highlighted – note that the Code Administrator have confirmed that the red line around 8.22.10(c) will be removed from the final Legal Text
