

Many parts of Scotland dry, but with occasional showers in the northeast. Becoming windy across southwest England and Wales with coastal gales. Tonight: Mostly dry with clear spells in far northwest. Elsewhere, outbreaks of rain for many, heavy in places. Strong winds in the southwest. Some fog patches and icy stretches central England.
