## **1. Introductions, Apologies and Declarations of Interest**

9577. Apologies were received from Steve Cox and David Monkhouse. David Monkhouse was able to join the meeting to introduce himself but then left after introductions from other Panel members were made. No declarations of interest were noted.

#### 2. Minutes from previous meetings

9578. The minutes from the Grid Code Review Panel held on 25 May 2023 were approved.

#### 3. Review of actions log

- 9579. The Panel discussed **Action 437**, GS informed the Panel that the workshops have concluded, and the feedback from stakeholders was being processed and outputs will feed into the joint consultation on secondary legislation and referred policy options. Further updates will be provided to Panel when available.
- 9580. Panel agreed to close **Action 437** on the basis that ML and GS would continue to follow up with the relevant teams.

#### 4. Chair's update

9581. There were no Chair updates.

#### **5. Authority Decisions**

- 9582. Ofgem publish a table that provides expected decision dates, or dates that they intend to publish an impact assessment or consultation, for code modifications/proposals that are with them for decision. This was last updated on 05 July 2023 and is published <u>here</u>.
- 9583. GS confirmed the expected decision date on <u>GC0148: Implementation of EU Emergency and</u> <u>Restoration Code Phase II is 19 July 2023.</u>

#### 6. New Modifications

9584. No new modifications were presented to the Panel.

#### 7. In flight modification updates

9585. ML talked the Panel through the progression of the in-flight modifications. The modification tracker can be found within the Grid Code Review Panel papers pack on the National Grid ESO website via the following link:

#### <u>GC0103: The introduction of harmonised Applicable Electrical Standards in GB to ensure</u> <u>compliance with the EU Connection Codes</u>

- 9586. ML advised the Panel that a new timeline has been created following the Workgroup reconvening after a pause. Additionally, further Terms of Reference had been added for the Panel to review.
- 9587. The Panel approved the Terms of Reference as submitted within the Panel papers but requested that an additional Terms of Reference be added requesting that an impact assessment be carried out. The Panel did not approve the timeline submitted within the Panel papers and requested that the Workgroup consider the Terms of Reference further along with the timeline and provide an update to the Panel after the next Workgroup meeting.

**Post Panel Note:** On 12th July 2023, ML provided a high-level overview of the Panel discussion with the GC0103 Proposer, outlining the reasoning behind the introduction of the impact assessment into the

Terms of Reference and the need for clear definition of the defect/ proposed solution to best equip the Workgroup to progress further.

#### <u>GC0117: Improving transparency and consistency of access arrangements across GB by the</u> <u>creation of a pan-GB commonality of Power Stations requirement</u>

- 9588. ML advised the Panel that a timeline extension was requested by the Workgroup to allow for further work to consider further the outputs from the Cost-Benefit Analysis.
- 9589. Panel agreed the new timeline.

# GC0154: Incorporation of interconnector ramping requirements into the Grid Code as per SOGL Article 119

- 9590. ML advised the Panel that a timeline extension was requested by the Workgroup to allow for further Workgroup meetings to take place following the Workgroup Consultation.
- 9591. Panel agreed the revised timeline.

#### GC0155: Clarification of Fault Ride Through Technical Requirements

- 9592. ML advised the Panel that a timeline extension was requested by the Workgroup to address some remaining concerns ahead of issuing the Workgroup Consultation.
- 9593. Panel agreed the revised timeline.

#### GC0161: Changes to OC6 to allow for site protection and demand disconnect rotation

- 9594. ML advised the Panel that the Workgroup had requested a title change to remove the reference to 'demand disconnect rotation' as it had been considered out of scope and that the title should reflect that.
- 9595. Panel agreed the revised title change from '<u>GC0161: Changes to OC6 to allow for site</u> protection and demand disconnect rotation' to '<u>GC0161: Changes to OC6 to allow for site</u> protection'.
- 9596. ML advised that the Workgroup had requested permission to add an additional Terms of Reference, relating to the compliance with Electricity Licence Conditions.
- 9597. Panel agreed the proposed addition to the Terms of Reference.

# 8. Prioritisation Stack / Dashboard

- 9598. The Panel reviewed the prioritisation stack and agreed that no further changes were required at this time.

- 9600. ML advised that a timeline update to <u>GC0159</u>: <u>Introducing Competitively Appointed</u> <u>Transmission Owners</u> would be provided at the next Panel due to a potential delay in the legislation passing through Parliament and that this might impact where Panel chose to place it on the Prioritisation stack.
- 9601. DS queried whether <u>GC0155: Clarification of the Fault Ride Through Technical</u> <u>Requirements</u> would have any implications on the Connections Reform activity. JW advised that he would investigate the query and respond and will inform the Panel.

9603. There were no Workgroup Reports presented to the Panel.

# **10. Draft Final Modification Reports**

## GC0156: Facilitating the Implementation of the Electricity System Restoration Standard

- <u>(ESRS)</u>
- 9604. ML outlined the objective and solution of the modification and explained the key differences between the Original Proposal and WAGCM1 (Workgroup Alternative Grid Code Modification).
- 9605. ML confirmed that as part of the Code Administrator Consultation there were 10 nonconfidential responses and 1 confidential response which had been issued to Ofgem; with all responses stating that one or both solutions better facilitated the Grid Code Applicable Objectives than the baseline.
- 9606. AJ confirmed that feedback on the Relevant Electrical Standards would be taken into consideration and that the document would be presented to the Panel in accordance with the relevant governance process such that it would be approved ahead of the expected submission of the GC0156 modifications to The Authority.
- 9607. ML confirmed that the other code ESRS related modifications would be sent to The Authority individually between July 2023 and November 2023. GS confirmed that no decision would be made until The Authority had all the relevant code Final Modification Reports.
- 9608. ML explained that, as there had been feedback provided during the Code Administrator Consultation associated with the legal text, the Panel would need to follow the review process under Governance Rule.22.4 ahead of progressing to the recommendation vote.
- 9609. The Panel agreed to go through each of the legal text queries (IDs) as part of the Annex 23 Summary of legal text queries raised through the Code Administrator Consultation spreadsheet, to confirm, for each item, whether they agreed that a change was required, and if so, whether the change is typographical or not.
- 9610. The Panel unanimously agreed that typographical changes, as presented in the Annex 23 Summary, were required to IDs: 2, 4-6, 8, 10-11, 13-14, 17, 19-21, 23-24, 28, 30, 32, 42-50, 54, 59, 62, 65, 69-72, 75-77 and 79 and instructed the Code Administrator to make the amendments under Governance Rule.22.4(i). The Panel unanimously agreed that no changes were required to IDs: 1, 3, 7 and 9.
- 9611. The Panel unanimously agreed that the proposal to remove the page numbers within the Data Registration Code in ID: 18 and ID: 25 was not required.
- 9612. The Panel requested that ML and AJ look to resolve ID: 15 and ID: 22 ahead of the Panel reconvening to review the remaining IDs.
