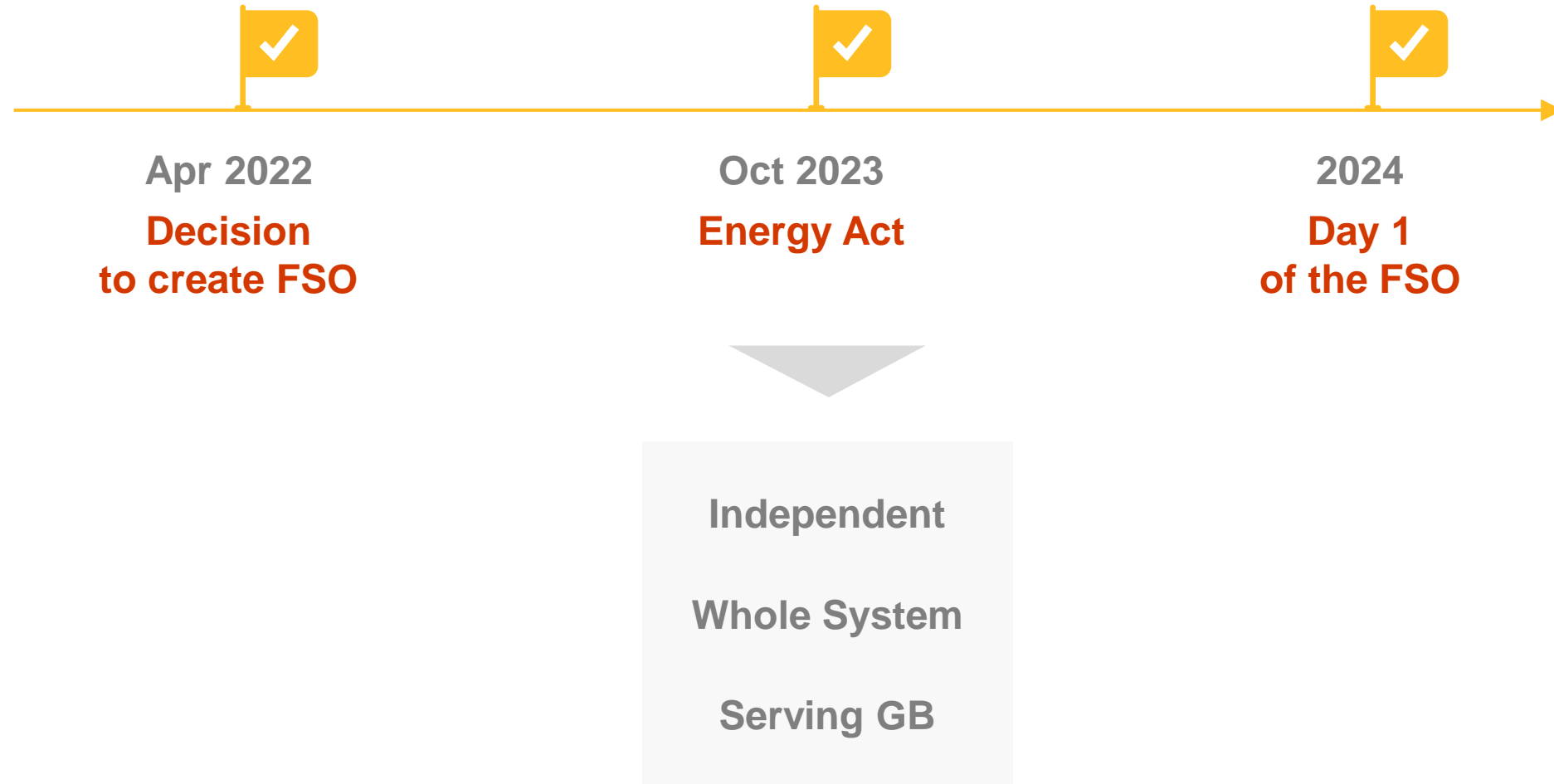

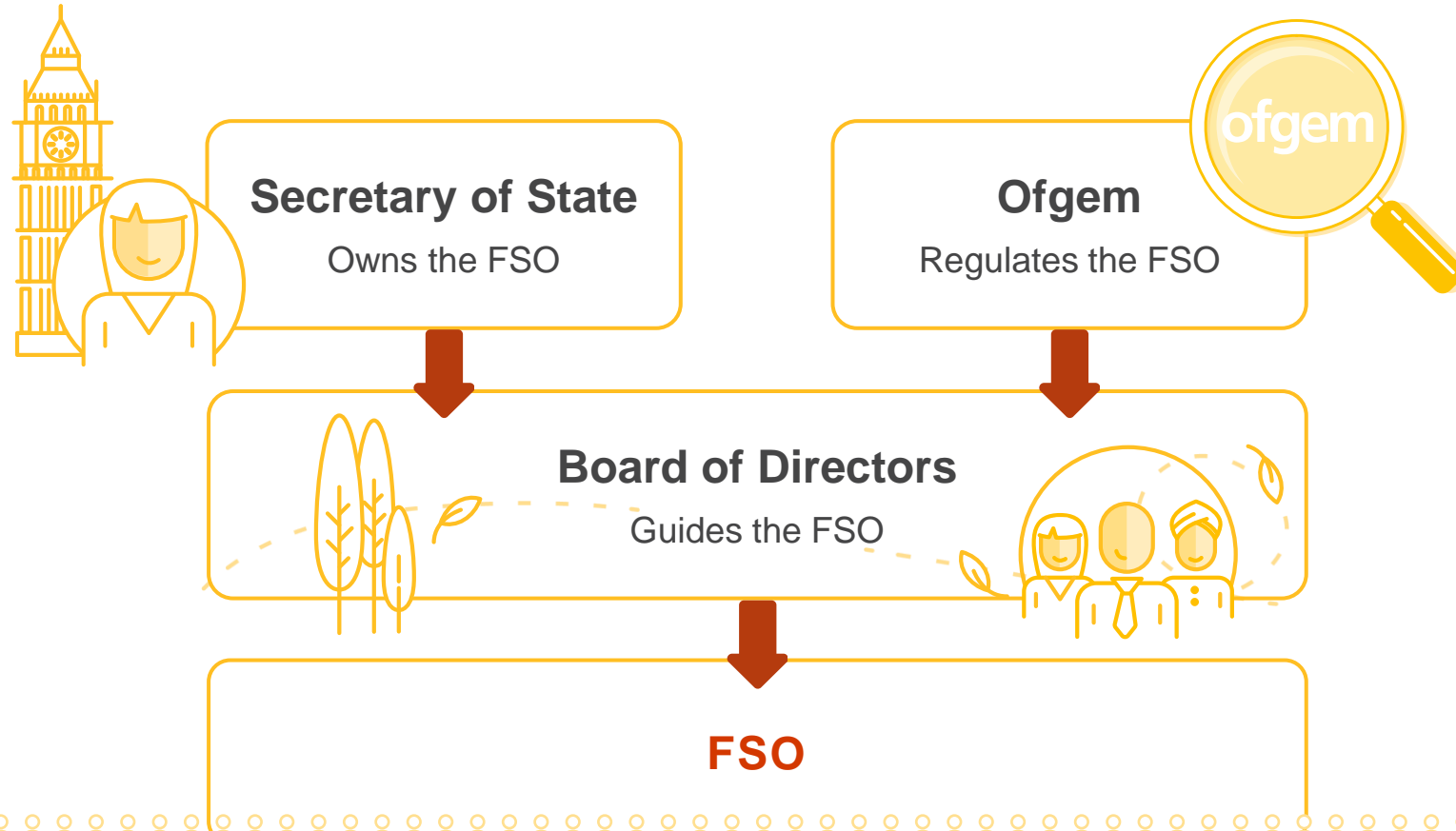
The challenges of energy security, sustainability and affordability are at the forefront of public consciousness

The FSO is set up as a public corporation independent from industry and Government

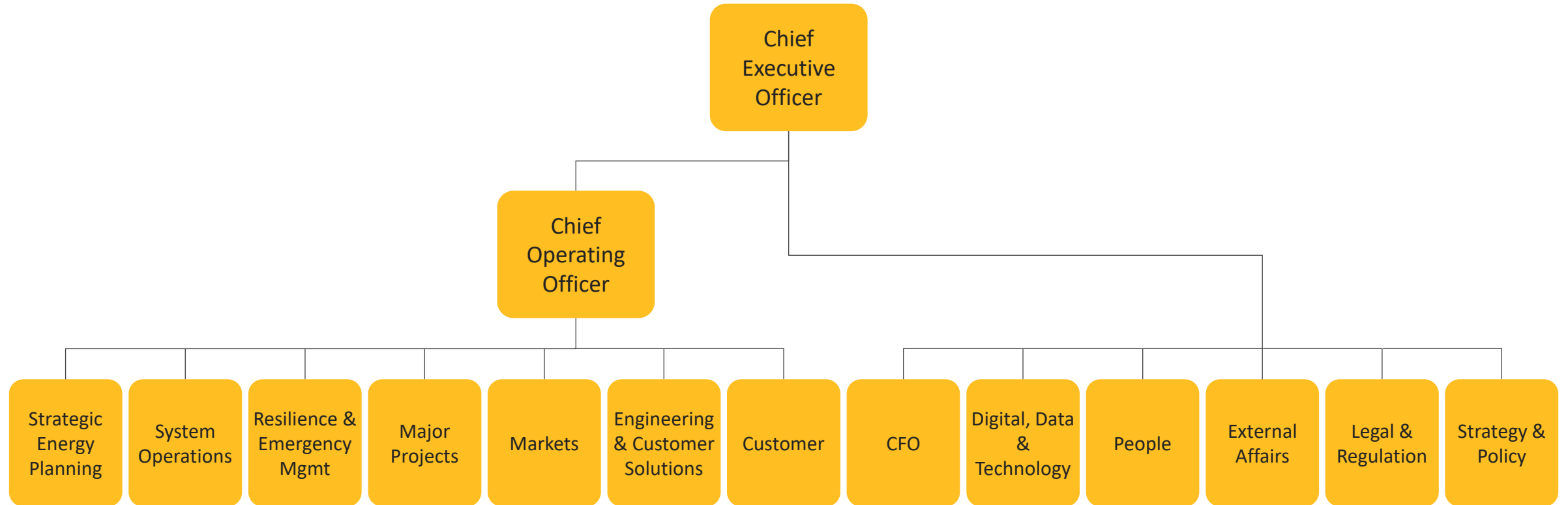
