



Possible snow over higher grounds by the evening along northern Pennines. Drier elsewhere but largely cloudy. Breezy around western coasts. Mild for most, though chilly in Scotland.  Tonight: Heaviest of the rain easing overnight, leaving a cloudy but occasionally drizzly night for much of Wales, northern England and southern Scotland. Frosty for Northern Ireland and northern Scotland.
