• JESG Actions Review

 The Technical Secretary noted the JESG Standing Actions and updates on current actions. The current version of the JESG action log, including any additions from this meeting, is <u>attached to this Headline</u> <u>Report.</u>

• GB Implementation of EU Codes into GB Frameworks approach

- John Young of NGET summarised the EID proposals. Following actions taken at the last JESG an
 overview document and some examples have been drafted. These are available on the JESG website.
 There were eighteen responses received to the proposals, the majority of these supported the current
 approach to implementing the EU Codes into the GB frameworks, there was also some support to the EID
 Lite Option 1. The full set of responses, including some that were received following this meeting can be
 found on our website.
- It was noted that these responses are now available for all industry members, Code Panels and Code Administrators to review when implementing the EU Codes into the GB Frameworks.
- Some discussions were had around feedback submitted in terms of a single GB code being formed and
 why this was not an option proposed. It was recognised that there were a number of processes occurring
 at the same time and that the JESG membership could submit their own response to the Authority
 Consultation on the Code Governance CMA remedies should it want to do so. The membership decided
 that they would do this. Action taken by JESG Technical Secretary to draft a response based on outline
 discussed in the meeting.
- The Group discussed the EU code implementation plan. It was noted that National Grid had developed a Plan that now needed to be validated by all Code Administrators and that a meeting to discuss this was scheduled for Friday 16th December. The Group noted that this plan could evolve to hold more information to aid the Authority in providing evidence on compliance. It was suggested that new columns could be added to reflect GB modification code numbers once the modifications were raised and in addition also, once implementation was complete, references to sections within the codes could be added. A further update following the Code Administrator meeting will be given at the next JESG meeting.

GLDPM – National Grid

 John Young informed the JESG membership that a consultation is now open on the application of the GLDPM in GB (Generation and Load Data Provision Methodology). A provisional position on implementation is proposed and explained in the covering letter, the code mapping assessment that underpins it is also available. All interested stakeholders are invited to submit their responses to the questions raised in the consultation by 26th January 2017. More information on this consultation can be found here.

BEIS – Sue Harrison

- Sue updated the JESG membership on the current challenges and changes within BEIS. She noted that
 DECC had been abolished and BEIS formed. She informed the Group that since June they have been
 carrying out a large amount of analysis on a number of different scenarios that had to all be fed into a
 central team. She noted just how complex the Energy industry is.
- Sue will update the membership further in 2017 with any developments that will impact EU code implementation, she explained that as it stands today there are a number of different options on the table and as such, at this stage, it is not clear what the direction will be for Energy.
