## 2. Ongoing Relevant Modification Proposals - Adelle McGill

Updates on these can be found in the TCMF slide pack.

### 3. Update on charging for integrated offshore – Adam Sims

The report from the informal working group process is due to be published later in the summer. Following this, one or a number of CUSC mods may be raised. Attendees suggested that it would be helpful to invite views from stakeholders, potentially through an open letter accompanying the report. Others suggested holding a focused session on the report in the afternoon of a future TCMF may be helpful.

The principle of using informal processes to develop topics such as this was discussed. It was felt that this was useful for complex topics that required looking at ranges of options and analysis for exploration purposes that might not fit into the standard CUSC timeline. It may also help with definition of scope for potential modification proposals. It was noted that if Industry parties felt that these processes did not progress quickly enough, a modification could still be raised by any party through the open governance process.

### 4. Generation embedded benefit – update from workshop – lain Pielage

The first meeting was held on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May to introduce issues and prioritise work going forward as this is a large and complex area. Draft Terms of Reference were also discussed and will be available on the webpage, alongside agendas and minutes from the meetings at <a href="http://www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Charges/Review-of-Embedded+Distributed-Generation-Benefit/">http://www.nationalgrid.com/uk/Electricity/Charges/Review-of-Embedded+Distributed-Generation-Benefit/</a>

Interest in attending the group was high, and has had to be limited in order to be practicable. However, as part of this process, National Grid would like to include as many views as possible. Patrick Hynes reiterated that he was happy to hold 1:1 meetings with stakeholders to understand the issues, and would contact the Chair of the Distributed Generation Forum to ascertain if attendance at that would be appropriate. It was also decided that the DCMF distribution list would be used to circulate meeting information.

#### 5. CMP213 impact assessment modelling - Andy Wainwright

Impact assessment results were updated in the response to the Code Administrator consultation. These formed part of the National Grid response and an overview was given at the meeting. Going forwards, Ofgem will be the main contact in terms of process regarding the impact assessment models.

#### 6. User commitment housekeeping – Tushar Singh

A CMP192 housekeeping modification is to be raised at the May CUSC Panel. These are a set of changes that are seen as largely uncontentious, and intended to "tidy up" the legal text. It was noted that there may be other issues around CMP192 but these may need further detailed work and therefore would need to be subject to a separate modification (and perhaps be added to the potential future modifications list).

### 7. Future modification topics – Patrick Hynes

At the March TCMF, attendees were invited to prioritise the list of potential future modification topics. The resultant rankings were discussed at this meeting, and the presenter explained National Grid's view on the current position and work ongoing in each of these areas. A potential additional topic regarding more detailed user commitment developments was discussed, and there was general agreement that, whilst not strictly a charging issue, this should be added to the list of potential topics.
